The Pieces of Our Lives

If the cover photo brings to mind your grandmother's favorite quilt, you're not far off. In 2006, the Arts and Culture Commission wanted to incorporate art in such a way as to highlight the best of Prescott Valley - its people, arts, culture, parks, and recreational activities. They wanted it to represent the very fabric of its residents. The name of the project "Pieces of Our Lives" came from the idea that people could bring old dishes that still held memories but were damaged or no longer being used. By contributing plates, cups, bowls, platters, and other dishes, people gave their memories a chance to live on and be enjoyed by others. The dishes were then broken and the pieces used to create the 7 1/2" tiles. Each square is a mosaic tile made up of the memories and heirlooms of the residents of Prescott Valley. Some of the broken tiles go back four generations.



The project took five years and the final tiles were installed in November 2011. Local stained glass artist Rebecca Brooks provided guidance and expertise to the community groups. If you've walked or biked the State Route 69 Multi-use Path, which parallels Highway 69 and extends from Navajo Road to Great Western Drive, you may have seen these tiles located at each of the resting points along the Path. The path extends 2.5 miles. That's 5 miles round trip, or about 10,000 steps on your Fitbit.

In April 2017 an additional set of tiles were added to the Central Core Multi-Use Path at the rest spot on the southeast corner of Navajo Drive and Lakeshore Drive. Created by Kim Welsh, who volunteered a substantial portion of her time, these tiles also include some of her personal memories and heirlooms. Carpet One volunteered their time and staff to install the tiles. Artistic elements continue to be added to this Multi-Use Path, which runs from Navajo Drive west to Lake Valley Road at the Civic Center. As of this writing, a colorful mural is planned under the Robert Road underpass.



My husband and I decided to spend a beautiful April afternoon walking the State Route 69 Multi-Use Path and view the tiles. We started at Navajo Road, where the first tiles were installed, and headed west along Highway 69. At each crossroad (Navajo Dr., Robert Road, Yavapai, Windsong, etc.) we

encountered a rest spot with inlaid tiles. Each set of tiles has a different color theme. What is particularly striking is that the tiles are not flat, but instead are dimensional, with some pieces extending out from the tile. We saw cup handles, buttons, and dainty pieces of china. We also saw seashells and a tile with a child's toy tractor. As we meandered down the path and looked at all the fragments contained in each tile and the memories they carried, we were reminded again of what brought us to Prescott Valley - the warmth and friendliness of its residents.



While stopping to photograph some tiles, a passing car, seeing our camera and assuming we were visitors, yelled to us "Thank you for visiting our town."

I waved to a small dog hanging out a car window, enjoying the afternoon, ears blowing in the breeze. The owner smiled and waved back to me. There were the poignant moments, too, as behind one set of tiles we came across a pine tree with a plaque, planted as part of the Town's Memorial Tree Program, and dedicated to two small boys who had passed away too young.

As we proceeded west of Glassford Hill Road, the tiles became more theme oriented. In one, waves were represented. In another, butterflies. On the return

trek, occupants in another passing car yelled "Looks like you are having fun!" We were, and after a short stop for ice cream cones that somehow morphed into the addition of burgers and fries, we resumed our walk and our musings over what we had seen. The path not only connects the Town, but through its art, it also connects our memories and speaks to who we are. Take a moment this summer to walk or bike the path and stop and truly examine the tiles. It is history, it is art, and it is healthy. If walking, at the end you'll have the satisfaction of seeing your Fitbit display fireworks as you take your 10,000th step.

The Prescott Area Artists' Studio Tour is an annual celebration of the arts and the artists in the Prescott Quad-City area. In January 2008, three local artists approached Mountain Artists Guild (MAG) as a possible Tour sponsor. The MAG president agreed an open studio tour fit MAG's art mission. MAG became the first Art Center, a place devoted to art education and practice, on the Tour.





In 2008 the "Quad-City Artists Open Studio Tour" was born with 52 juried artists and one Art Center. The MAG-sponsored Studio Tour has been held every year since. In 2010 the name was changed to the "Prescott Area Artists' Studio Tour". Dates for the Tour moved around until the fourth year when the date was set as the "first weekend in October". The number of artists, studios and Art Centers has varied from year to year.

Since the beginning, artists have been asked to demonstrate

how their art is made. This allows visitors to learn about the materials used, the techniques employed, and the work involved as well as to visit with artists in their working studios. The Tour features artists who exhibit locally, nationally and internationally.

Artists are encouraged to donate a piece of artwork for a raffle. Tour visitors can purchase raffle tickets at each studio and use them at any studio. Raffle money helps with costs for

the following year's Tour and, as of two years ago, helps sponsor children's art programs at MAG and 'Tis Gallery and Art Center.





Are you all tied up? By Dr. Shelly Klein



Ankyloglossia, or tongue-tie, is a common abnormality from birth where the tissue under the tongue (lingual frenum) is overly short and tight (posterior ankyloglossia) or aberrantly attached near the tip of the tongue (anterior ankyloglossia), “tying” the tongue to the floor of the mouth.

The tongue is an important organ which is largely responsible for mouth and facial development and growth. Ankyloglossia has been linked to abnormal suck swallow pattern in newborns (leading to difficulty with or painful breastfeeding or moms “drying up” after 3 months of breast feeding). In infants and toddlers, reflux, fussiness, dental cavities, messy drinking, difficulty spoon feeding, refusal of textured foods and speech disturbances are also frequently observed. For older children and adults, tongue tie contributes to a high and narrow palate, incorrect bite pattern (cross bite), or under bite with prominent lower jaw, teeth malalignment, smaller mid face, and mouth breathing. Mouth breathing may be a factor in tonsillar enlargement which can obstruct the airflow and exacerbate mouth breathing and contribute to the abnormal facial growth. A potential outcome of tongue tie is sleep disordered breathing (SDB), snoring, and obstructive sleep apnea (OSA) in older patients which can be related to behavioral issues due to lack of sleep. In addition, tethered oral tissue as a possible causation of unexplained asphyxia (SIDS) in infants has been documented in an article from the Journal of Rare Disorders: Diagnosis and Therapy dated February 2016.

The tongue attaches to several head and neck bones as well as multiple face and neck muscles. When the tongue is tied, this restriction requires use of accessory muscles to perform functions such as breathing, breastfeeding, chewing and swallowing. This hyperactivity of the neck and jaw muscles leads to changes in bony structure, more compensation of muscles and ultimately stressors to the central nervous system. Orofacial myofunctional therapy (OMT) is an important adjunctive therapy to correct these abnormal compensatory changes and stressors.

Treatment for ankyloglossia is a minor outpatient surgical procedure to release the “tie” (frenectomy). There are various methods including using a scalpel, scissors, or lasers. Using a scalpel or scissors carries a potential risk of bleeding, as well as the limitation of incomplete release due to thick oral tissue (that could bleed more). CO2 laser frenectomy cuts while stopping bleeding and minimizes post procedure edema. No sutures are typically used with CO2 frenectomy and patients quickly return to their usual activities.

Once released, exercises are recommended to decrease scarring and recurrence. In addition, OMT is recommended to correct any muscular compensation and to tone the muscles now that the tongue can move correctly. OMT helps re-establish correct swallowing, chewing, speaking and breathing patterns that were limited due to the “tie”.
