# HELPING SENIORS HELP THEMSELVES



**Joni Zeroles-Solon is the owner and lead agent of Secure Options for Seniors and the creator of The Retirement Education Center (The R.E.C.) program beginning this Fall. She began SOS in early 2016**

**after 10 years of working as an independent agent. Previously, she has held many positions in both finance and business management.**

In 1979 Joni began working at Wells Fargo Bank (formerly Norwest and First Interstate Bank of Arizona) in Phoenix, Arizona. During her twenty years at Wells Fargo Bank she held the positions of Assistant Manager, Merger Project Manager, Automation Project Manager, and Risk Management Analyst. In 1999 she moved to Prescott after having two children, Dylan Cain Solon and Summer Rain Solon, with spouse Jason Robert Solon. Soon after she began working at Compass Bank in Prescott where she held the positions of Acquisition Specialist (a position that was created specifically for her) and Trainer/ Risk Manager. After leaving Compass Bank in 2001, Joni began working as a self-employed consultant. She provided business management services (office management; tax preparation;

financial planning and projections; and general accounting) to a Private Client List in the real estate and health insurance industry in the Prescott area.

In her years of working as an agent she noticed a gap in typical senior care and insurance salesmanship. There are roughly 10,000 people a day turning 65 in America. Unlike in the past most of them will continue to work after they turn 65. Based on recent research gathered from firsthand experiences, information on SSA.gov and Medicare.gov, as well as discussions with HR departments directly related to her clients, she found that finding helpful information is not an easy task. In addition, employers don't seem to be informed either. SOS's plan is to educate those who are approaching or already over 65, and their employers, on how to deal with this new insurance market. Many things have changed for Medicare in recent years, and the goal of The R.E.C. is to ease the transition of these changes into the community. To do so, they

will be approaching the sale of their products from an educational stand point, reaching out to the grassroots through a community approach, partnering with employers, churches, community centers, libraries, senior centers, etc.

# FIREFIGHTER ANGEL



Firefighter Angel Foundation is organized exclusively for the charitable purpose of alleviating the hardship experienced by underprivileged children and families throughout the year. One of our ways of giving is during the Christmas Season to families with children who have fallen on hard times or when crisis hits such as the loss of a parent, sibling or significant caregiver in the child's life. Each year, a volunteer Santa accompanied by volunteer Elves arrive at the selected child's home on a fire truck to deliver the wrapped gifts of toys, clothing and toiletries specifically geared towards that child. These deliveries consist of a caravan of public safety vehicles to include several fire trucks and police cars. We recognize that a child is not an individual unit within a family so all school-aged siblings and the adult care provider(s) (parent, grandparent, etc.) within that household are also provided gifts as well. Additionally, we collect and

Over the years the FAF has continuously grown and now has an independent 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation. FAF obtained its non-profit status in 2015.

distribute food boxes containing items that will make a meal during Christmas a little more enjoyable.

Firefighter Angel Foundation conducts several other events throughout the year such as:

Fill the Bus event, where FAF has partnered with StoneRidge and Humboldt Unified School District to park a school bus at the Prescott Club. Community members graciously donate school items and load the bus. In return for making the donation StoneRidge provides street tacos for free to those who provide donations.

Back to School Giveaway, where backpacks, stuffed full of items children need for school, are given out to kids in need throughout the community. FAF collects these items throughout the year and at the Fill the Bus event. Our wonderful volunteers sort through all of the items as they come in and personalize each backpack for school aged boys and girls.

The Firefighter Angel Foundation conducts two major fundraisers each year where all proceeds go directly back to FAF and ultimately to the children and families that we serve. The first fundraiser of the year is our annual Pancake Breakfast. This event takes place on the Sunday following Easter at the Central Arizona Fire & Medical Authorities station 61 on Road 3 North in Chino Valley as well as at the Central Arizona Regional Training Academy on Valley Road in Prescott Valley. We have this event at two locations on the same day so that we can include as many community members as possible in areas that we serve. The

# THE COUGAR ARCHERY PROGRAM



In 2008, The Cougar Archery Program debuted in Chino Valley, Arizona, as a small, seven person team of 4th and 5th graders with a willing but clueless coach at Territorial Elementary School. After 10 years of growing pains, the now hugely successful program has been established at Del Rio Elementary, Heritage Middle School, and Chino

**Valley High School, headed by several dedicated coaches. Last year, 120 students participated as part of the after-school club.**

The program uses instinctive archery target style, designed by the National Archery in Schools Program (NASP), brought to us by Arizona Game and Fish. The idea was started by the Kentucky Fish and Wildlife Resources Department to get kids interested in conservation, education, and the outdoors.

Our club is one of 10,735 schools that participated in NASP in 2017-2018!

Archery is introduced to all students once a year during school hours to preserve its inclusive design. Tryouts are held each season for team placement.

It is one of the safest school sports: with 1.3 million students shooting arrows. So far, there have been no incidents!

As a teacher and a coach, I have seen firsthand the incredible benefits this program provides students. Students who participate in archery, care more about academics and do better in school because they are part of team.

I have worked with students who, at the beginning of the season, can barely pull back the bow string and get an arrow halfway down the lane. By the end of a season, students can talk "aiming points" and hit bullseyes! Archery

boosts an individual's confidence, encourages sportsmanship and bonding with teammates.

Having an archery team has given local businesses an exciting and unique sport to support! We could not do what we do without the help of our awesome community. We practice outside on our very own awesome field, which was donated to us two years ago by several local business owners. We have qualified to compete at National Competitions, which the community has also supported through generous tax credit and regular donations. These experiences have proven to be incredible and invaluable experiences for our archers, and the coaches are so incredibly grateful for all the support.

Our biggest need right now is equipment, but we can only support as many students as we have equipment for.

All schools in the NASP program use Genesis Original bows and Easton 1820 aluminum

arrows, which helps level the playing field. Through experience, we have learned that sharing bows between several students is possible, but not ideal. The bows are not meant to be constantly adjusted to accommodate different archers (regarding tension/poundage, etc.).

Our students have now ventured into 3D archery competition. They use 3D animals as targets from the same distances and the same scoring rings as Target/Bullseye archery. Our BIG goal this season is to purchase a set of these targets. This would enable the kids to have practice opportunity

on our field, so they are better prepared for competitions.

After being involved with this program for the past 10 years, I can truly say that I love what it does for the students! It is so fun to watch their excitement about the sport, and to work with them throughout the season to hone their shooting skills as they build their confidence!

Working closely with Library Management, Scott Bruner and Darlene Westcott, we encourage public understanding and appreciation of the library. All that we do is exclusively for the purposes of achieving those goals, and done by volunteers, without benefit to

any individual or member. We have a wonderful library where people of all ages can come to read, use computers, check out books, movies, and music. It also provides a variety of children's programs that encourage reading, provide

entertainment and fun activities. There is also a bookstore within the library run by the Friends group where books, movies, puzzles, and music can be purchased.
